## ITEMS PROHIBITED FOR SALE IN THE PROXIBID MARKETPLACE

The Proxibid Marketplace connects buyers and sellers of highly valued items. If you can find it online, you can find it on Proxibid. However, some items simply aren't in the spirit of the Proxibid Marketplace and are not available. The following types of items may not be listed on Proxibid:

- 1. Drugs and drug paraphernalia, including any medical drug claims about an item
- 2. Items made from certain animals, including, but not limited to those animals deemed endangered or threatened under the US Endangered Species Act
- 3. Ivory or bones from ivory-producing animals such as whales or elephants (see below for more information)
- 4. Human remains or body parts
- 5. Illegal, counterfeit, or stolen items
- 6. Items that promote, support, or glorify hatred toward or otherwise demean people based upon race, ethnicity, religion, gender, gender identity, disability, or sexual orientation, including items or content that promote organizations with such views
- 7. Hazardous materials (for example: materials that are flammable, explosive, corrosive, poisonous, etc.). Ammunition, and black and smokeless powder are permitted as specified in the Proxibid Unified User Agreement
- 8. Firearms intended for export or requiring international shipping
- 9. Firearms parts or accessories that violate applicable federal, state, or local laws and regulations (for example: bump stocks)
- 10. Items subject to the ITAR under USML Categories I, II, III, and V (e.g., machine guns, silencers, linked ammunition, and explosives, as specified in each of the listed USML categories)
- 11. Catalytic converters and test pipes

## IMPORTANT LAWS REGARDING IVORY COULD IMPACT YOUR SALE

On February 11, 2014, President Barack Obama introduced his National Strategy for Combating Wildlife Trafficking, which will have a dramatic impact on the future sale of antique ivory. While the new regulation does make exceptions for "bona fide" antiques and clarifies antiques as "items that are more than 100 years old and that meet other requirements under the Endangered Species Act," the burden of proof will fall on the collector, auctioneer, or dealer to ensure that an item for sale meets these criteria.
